### **BUKETTRAUBE**

This rare cross of Silvaner and Schaiva Grossa (Trollinger) exhibits delicate floral notes of rose petals, dried mango, apricot and Muscat Flavors. A Well balanced wine with a delicate sweetness and crisp acidity. Enjoyed as an aperitif; partner to spicy fusion cuisine; Cape Malay curries or as an alternative to certain cheeses. This vintage proves to be one of the best over the past decade.

### **SAUVIGNON BLANC**

An aromatic Sauvignon Blanc with grassy notes, white asparagus undertones and strong hints of capsicum, gooseberries and lemon zest. A refreshing, crisp acidity finishes off the initial sensation of creaminess on the mid-palate. The ideal companion to traditional chicken pie, but also try it with shellfish or pork.

### **CHENIN BLANC**

A Truly unique style of Chenin Blanc, offering a crisp freshness with layers of winter melon, grapefruit, green apples and fleshy white pear. Five months lees contact ensures a mouth coating creaminess on the palate. This is a fine example of the high potential that this grape variety is capable of when treated with care. This wine will be well suited to creamy dishes and light summer lunches.

### **MERLOT - SHIRAZ**

A fruit driven blend of 75% Merlot and 25% Shiraz. Expect a wine filled with ripe plums, raspberry and hints of dark chocolate with smoky nuances leaving a sweet creamy texture. The Juicy tannins make this wine approachable and ready to drink but will improve over the next 4 years. A must with every braai but also suited to rich game dishes.

### **CABERNET SAUVIGNON**

Concentrated dark fruits of black currant and cassis, laced with subtle mint undertone. Careful use of oak lends a hint of tobacco leaf, vanilla and smokey element to this complex wine. Expect this wine to mature gracefully in the next 8 years. A Prime example of a well-crafted South African Cabernet Sauvignon.

### **SHIRAZ**

A powerful yet elegant Shiraz with a multitude of aromatic layers and rich concentration. Expect Intense mulberry flavors layered with roasted coffee beans, dark chocolate and spice. A well-structured wine with a lingering velvet finish that will age superbly. Pair with South African game, powerful cheeses such as young cheddar or gruyere or indulge by pairing with intricate dark bitter chocolate.
